ASH WEDNESDAY 2021

Rite for Holy Communion with the Distribution of Ashes

(For use during the pandemic in the Diocese of Hong Kong)

GREETING

Priest: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

R. Amen.

Priest: The Lord be with you.

R. And with you spirit.

Priest: Brothers and sisters, the pandemic has made it difficult for us to take part at the Mass of Ash Wednesday, yet the mercy of God is boundless. Now, let us confess our sins, receive the Body of Christ, and sprinkle ashes on us, so as to prepare ourselves for a fruitful Lenten Season:

(pause)

All: I confess to almighty God and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have greatly sinned, in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done and in what I have failed to do, through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault; therefore, I ask blessed Mary ever-Virgin, all the Angels and Saints, and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God.

Priest: May almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us our sins, and bring us to everlasting life.

R. Amen.

Let us count on the Word of God, and pray with confidence to the Father in the words our Savior gave us, so as to prepare ourselves for Holy Communion which is always a healing remedy for us sinners:

R. Our Father....

(While Our Father is being said or sung, the Priest goes to the tabernacle and takes the ciborium or pyx containing the body of the Lord, places it on the altar and genuflects.)

HOLY COMMUNION

(At the conclusion of Our Father, taking the host, the Priest raises it slightly over the vessel or pyx, and facing the people, says:)

Priest: Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.

R. Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.

(The faithful are to sanitize their hands before they proceed to receive Communion; Holy Communion should be received only 'in the hand'.)

(A period of silence may now be observed. The Communion Antiphon of the day may be recited: He who ponders the law of the Lord day and night will yield fruit in due season. (Cf. Ps 1: 2-3))

PRAYER AFTER COMMUNION

May the Sacrament we have received sustain us, O Lord, that our observances of the Lenten Season may be pleasing to you and be for us a healing remedy. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

BLESSING AND SPRINKLING OF ASHES

Priest: Dear brothers and sisters, let us humbly ask God our Father to bless these ashes, through which we plead for God's help that we may observe the Lenten repentance fruitfully.

After a brief prayer in silence, and, with hands extended, he continues:

O God, who are moved by acts of humility and respond with forgiveness to works of penance, lend your merciful ear to our prayers and in your kindness pour out the grace of your blessing on your servants who are marked with these ashes, that, as they follow the Lenten observances, they may be worthy to come with minds made pure to celebrate the Paschal Mystery of your Son. Through Christ our Lord.

R. Amen.

He addresses all those present and only once, applying it to all in general:

"Repent, and believe in the Gospel", or

"Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return".

The faithful comes to the Priest.

The Priest takes the ashes and sprinkles them on the head of each one without saying anything, and without touching their heads.

Then the faithful leave in silence.
